Good Gifts

If you, then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in Heaven give good gifts to those who ask him! Matthew 7:11

I have a vivid memory of the first gift I ever bought. It was for my sister Wanda, who was born about a month after I started kindergarten. I only had school in the mornings, so soon after Wanda was born, my mom took me to the dime store one afternoon to shop for Christmas presents while my brother and sister were in school. I have no recollection of what I bought for them, but I remember being immediately attracted to a wooden object that looked like a rattle and picked it up to show Mom what I wanted to give the baby. I didn't know that it was a darning doll, but of course, my mother did. However, she didn't squelch my enthusiasm by telling me that the gift I had picked wasn't a good gift for a baby, and Wanda loved it. It was just the right size to stuff in her mouth, which was what she did with most things, and

she also waved it with a vengeance so that more than once I was on the receiving end of her unintentional wielding of that wooden weapon.

Sixty years later, my husband Jeffrey and I spent the night at my sister and brother in law's house in Green Bay before flying out of the airport there. When I took my shoes off to relax, I discovered a hole in my sock. I had planned on wearing those socks again in the morning, since the rest of my socks were in the suitcase in the car ready for our early departure, so I asked Wanda if she had a sewing basket. She brought out the tin that our mother had used for her sewing things, and there was the darning doll! The years had coated it with a beautiful pa tina, and the wood was denser than the one I had bought a few years before at an antique store to use for its intended purpose. Wanda's darning doll was not scratched like the one I had bought for \$2.00, twenty times the cost of the one I had gotten in 1956, which now looked better than new!

Of course, maybe Wanda's darning doll looked so beautiful because, as socks got less expensive and the time spent

darning became more valuable than the socks, the darning doll hadn't gotten much use after Wanda was done playing with it in infancy. Still, seeing it looking so smooth and shiny reminded me of why I thought it would be a wonderful gift for my baby sister. However, by then I had long since realized that the even better gift was having a mom who hadn't dampened my spirit for gift giving!

May all your gift giving bring you joy, and may all your gifts be good gifts!
